Project objective	To ensure gender equality and reduce gender based discrimination by providing services to women victims of gender based violence and male perpetrators, and raising capacities of relevant professionals.
Targeted beneficiaries	 2000 Women, victims of GBV; 80 Perpetrators of domestic violence and gender based violence; 14 Judges; 12 Police Officers; 24 Prison and Probation Officers; 500 Young boys and girls through awareness raising interventions and activities; 150 Community members in intervention zones; 550.000 Broader communities through the media campaign.
Main activities	 Providing multidisciplinary counselling to women who are victims of GBV and DV; Conducting professional psychosocial counselling with GBV perpetrators; Conduct trainings to prison and probation staff in intervention zones, to family judges and police officers;







	 Developing and publishing of a handbook with guidelines for police officers on how to properly handle cases of GBV; Organisation of awareness raising events with community and organizing workshops in selected schools.
Project results	 Gender equality is promoted by providing psychosocial, legal and educational counselling to women who are victims of gender based violence and through rehabilitation of perpetrators;
	 Improved performance of judges and other professionals (family judges, probation and police officers in prison and police units of DV)working with victims and perpetrators, as a result of targeted interventions for lobbying and capacity building;
	 Increased awareness and knowledge about gender equality of youth and community and changed attitudes about gender roles of the young people in the intervention areas through introduction of innovative education/prevention approaches and awareness.
